Conclusions

Wellbeing is multi-faceted and difficult to measure; we have reported indicators of engagement. Although the response rate to the survey was low, feedback was overall positive; social response bias was likely a confounding factor. Overall the project has been well received and raised awareness of the importance of staff wellbeing.
