
Improving confidence and clinical decision-making skills in trainees at PAU referrals, through Targeted Training

<u>Introduction:</u> Pediatric Assessment Unit (PAU) is a dedicated facility providing assessment, observation and treatment of an illness, without the need for immediate inpatient admissions for the acutely presenting infant, child or young person¹. Evidence shows that the hospitals with a PAU had higher discharge rates and lower numbers of referrals from ED². However, working in a busy PAU can be challenging for the Pediatric trainees. We identified the existing challenges among the Pediatric trainees of working in PAU and implemented solutions, improving confidence and clinical decision-making skills.



<u>Conclusion:</u> Identification of trainee needs and providing targeted interventions improved the confidence and clinical decision making skills among pediatric trainee at managing CAU referrals.
